Dear Friends,

The purpose of the Aurora East Educational Foundation (AEEF) is to provide enrichment programs and educational opportunities for students in Aurora East Schools, District 131. To that end, the Foundation provided opportunities through its Mini-Grant program, Tom-A-Hawk Turkey Trot, Annual Giving Program and, of course, scholarships through the Excellence in Education Endowment, Careers in Education Endowment and Career and Technical Education programs. In all, AEEF programs have enriched the educational experience for all students in District 131.

In 2023, the AEEF transitioned to an on-line registration program for the golf outing, raised more scholarships and revived the Razzle Dazzle Faculty/Staff talent show, and improved communications with District 131.



For 2024, the AEEF will be focusing on improving communication in the scholarship program and working collaboratively with the district to fund a Media and Production position within the district. 2023 Mini-Grants

The Aurora East Educational Foundation awarded 19 Mini-Grants for a total of \$25,096.58. The grant funds were used for books, support for the Special Olympic E-Sports program, traveling musical keypads for the elementary schools, flexible seating, a "Leap Year" musical, SEL Science field trip, attendance at a Percussive Arts convention, supplies for the Life Skills program, certification for students in the Drone program, and equipment to be used to support the Aurora Nostalgia project. These expenditures were used to enhance the educational experience of over 8,000 students, which represents two out of every three students in District 131.

The AEEF is so fortunate to have so many wonderful supporters of our scholarship program. Those folks who have contributed to the scholarship program include parents, alumni, former teachers, school vendors and other Aurora Area Businesses. This year there were over sixty scholarship donors, thirty-six were for a full \$1,000 scholarship.

Our goal with the new Scholarship Committee is to better communicate with the donors as well as with students who have been awarded scholarships. To that end, it is important to note that the AEEF scholarship program is administered by the Community Foundation of the Fox River Valley (CFFRV). The CFFRV scholarship program complies the the criterion established by the Internal Revenue Service.

The AEEF has two scholarship endowments, the Excellence in Education Endowment, Careers in Education Endowment, the AEEF awards two types of scholarships. One for Academic Excellence and the other for students pursuing careers in Education. Currently, the Board is researching establishing three new endowments; (1) a needs-based scholarship; (2) careers in technical education; and (3) an athletic scholarship endowment.

In addition to these scholarship donors, the AEEF also received donations that represented partial scholarships that were rolled into an "other scholarship contributions" which represents a single scholarship. In addition, we hope to collaborate with the AEEF on partial funding of a media specialist position that will enhance the public face of both the District and the AEEF.
